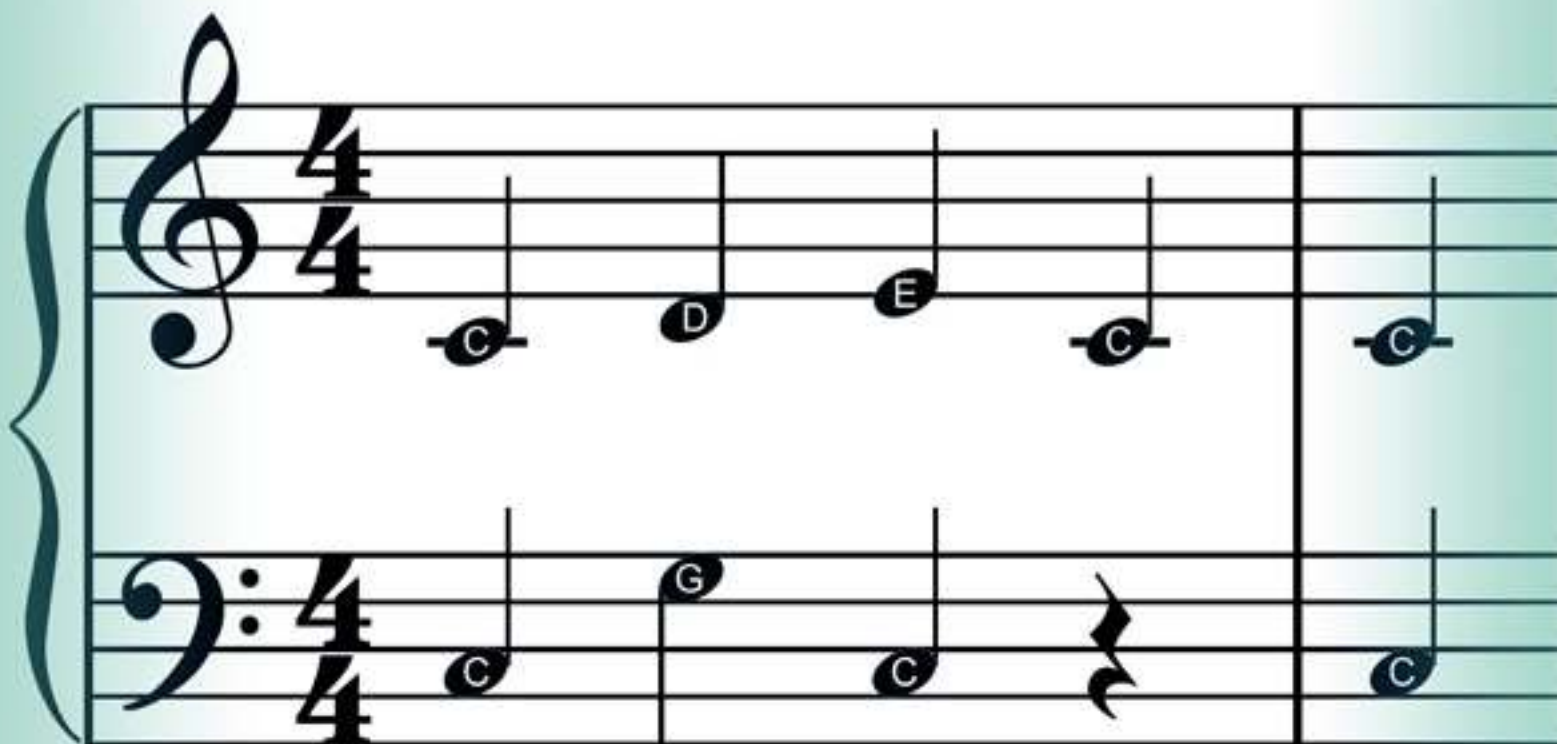

INTRO

THE PURPOSE WITH this ebook is to make it as easy as possible for you to play by musical notes on the piano. The note letters that is visible on the note signs makes it much easier to find the right notes to play.

When reading piano notes, you play the notes in the lower part with your left hand and the notes in the upper part of the note system with your right hand.

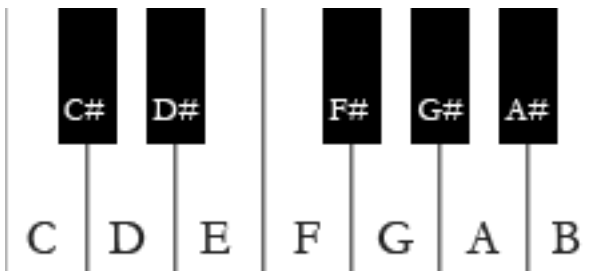
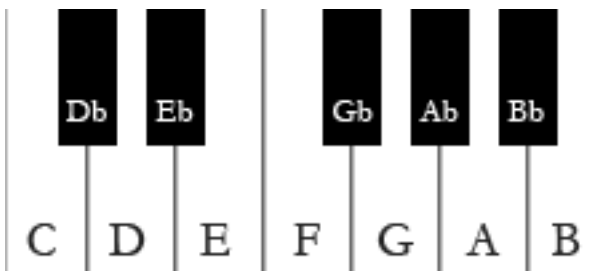

SONGS INFO

Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star

"Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star" is a popular English lullaby. The lyrics are from an early-19th-century English poem by Jane Taylor, *The Star*. The poem, which is in couplet form, was first published in 1806 in *Rhymes for the Nursery*, a collection of poems by Taylor and her sister Ann.

Mary Had a Little Lamb

"Mary Had a Little Lamb" is an English language nursery rhyme of nineteenth-century American origin.

Brother John (Frère Jacques)

"Frère Jacques", also known in English as "Brother John", is a nursery rhyme of French origin.

Scarborough Fair

"Scarborough Fair" is a traditional English ballad.

It's Raining, It's Pouring

"It's Raining, It's Pouring" is an English language nursery rhyme and children's song.

He's Got the Whole World in His Hands

"He's Got the Whole World in His Hands" is a traditional American spiritual, first published in 1927.

Row, Row, Row Your Boat

"Row, Row, Row Your Boat" is an English language nursery rhyme and a popular children's song.

Au Clair de la Lune

"Au clair de la lune" ("By the Light of the Moon") is a French folk song of the 18th century. Its composer and lyricist are unknown. Its simple melody is commonly taught to beginners learning an instrument.

Hush Little Baby

"Hush, Little Baby" is a traditional lullaby, thought to have been written in the Southern United States. Like most folk songs, the author and date of origin are unknown.

For He's a Jolly Good Fellow

"For He's a Jolly Good Fellow" is a popular song that is sung to congratulate a person on a significant event, such as a birthday.

This Land Is Your Land

"This Land Is Your Land" is one of the United States' most famous folk songs. Its lyrics were written by American folk singer Woody Guthrie in 1940, based on an existing melody.

Tom Dooley

"Tom Dooley" is a North Carolina folk song based on the 1866 murder of a woman named Laura Foster in Wilkes County, North Carolina, allegedly by Tom Dula. The song is best known today because of a hit version recorded in 1958 by The Kingston Trio.

When the Saints Go Marching In

"When the Saints Go Marching In", often referred to as "The Saints", is a Black spiritual. Though it originated as a Christian hymn, it is often played by jazz bands.

Do-Re-Mi

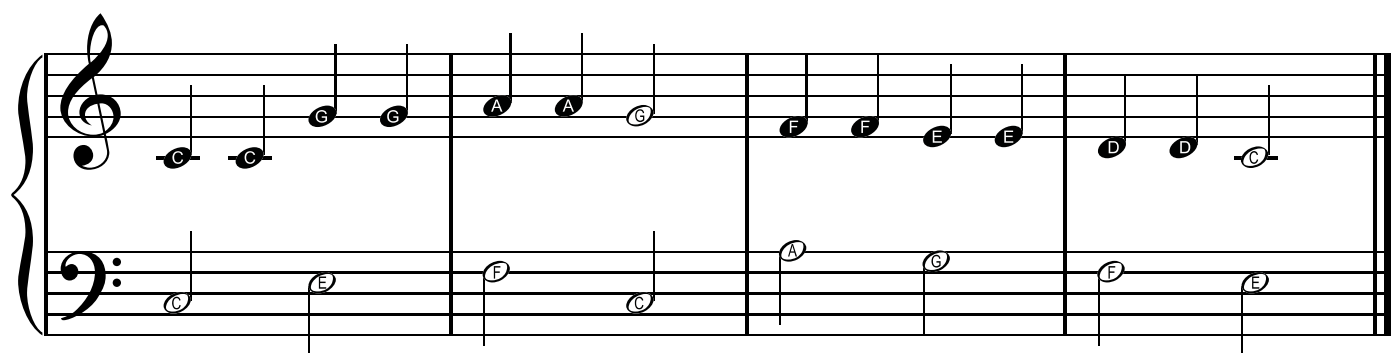
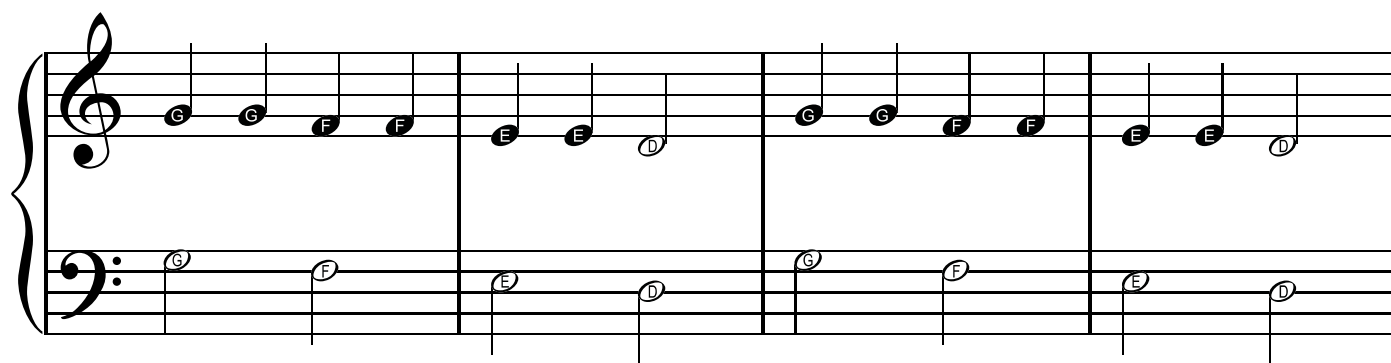
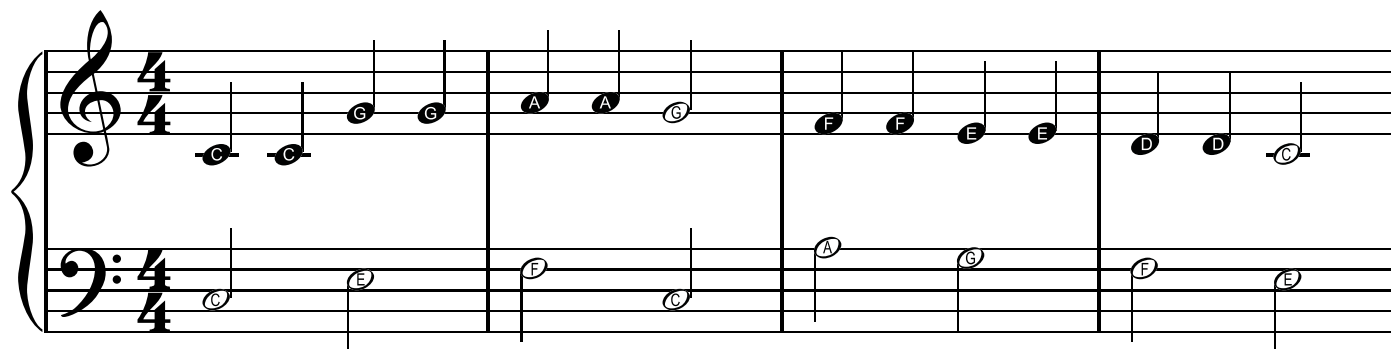
"Do-Re-Mi" is a show tune from the 1959 Rodgers and Hammerstein musical *The Sound of Music*. Within the story, it is used by Maria to teach the notes of the major musical scale to the Von Trapp children who learn to sing for the first time.

Silent Night

"Silent Night" ("Stille Nacht") is a popular Christmas carol, composed in 1818 by Franz Xaver Gruber to lyrics by Joseph Mohr.

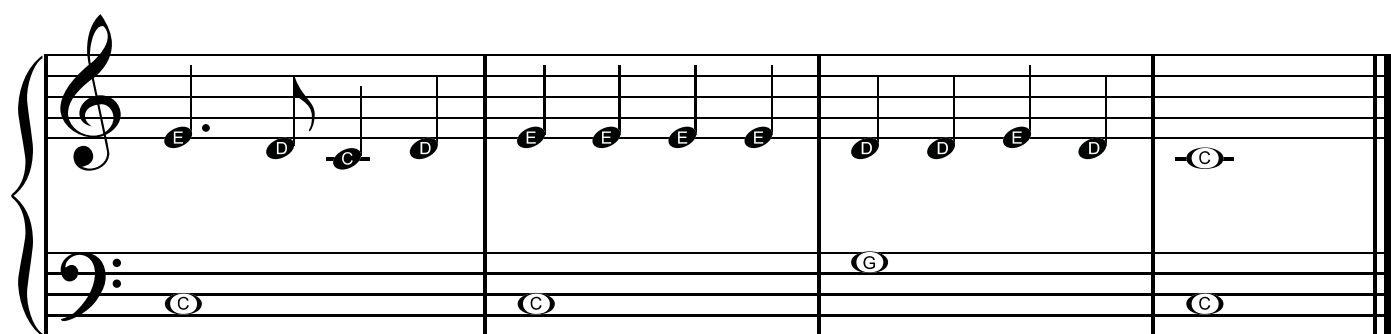
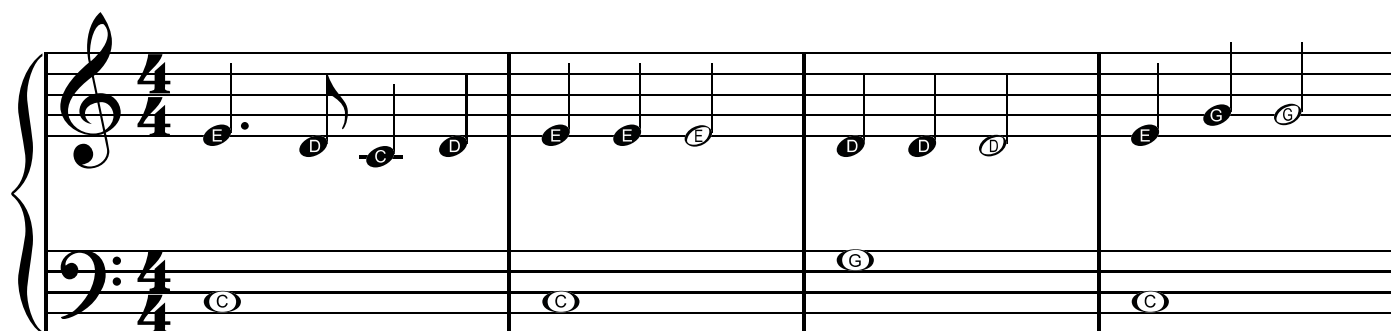
